Restore the workers' compensation cuts. Make the publicly-owned State Compensation Fund the only workers' comp source. Unify it with a state system of universal health coverage. No insurance company profits and no insurance company campaign contributions.

Double the minimum wage and index it to the cost of living. Let's stop taking crumbs for our labor.

Restore the vehicle license fee to its previous levels. Repeal Proposition 13. Tax the rich and their corporations to meet human needs.

Balance the state budget by closing prisons. Prisons cost an average of \$100,000,000 a year to run. Closing five of them would save half a billion dollars!

Restore democratic control over the Oakland and West Contra Costa School Districts.

Vote **Jesse Arreguin, Jack Harrison, Jason Overman** and **Eleanor Walden** for Berkeley Rent Board: Support the Committee to Defend Affordable Housing's pro-tenant slate.

Vote **YES** on Measure P (Berkeley): Amend miscellaneous provisions of Berkeley's rent control law, most notably to regulate Section 8 rents above the federal payment standard.

Vote **YES** on Measure Q (Berkeley): Direct police to make enforcement of state laws against prostitution their lowest priority, and call for repeal of laws making prostitution a crime.

Vote **YES** on Measure R (Berkeley): Require the city to issue permits for medical marijuana dispensaries, and remove fixed limits on the amount of medical marijuana patients and caregivers can possess.

Vote **YES** on Measure S (Berkeley): Protect street trees, by banning the removal or alteration of non-hazardous public trees except in limited circumstances, and establishing mechanisms for enforcement.

Vote **NO** on Measure Y (Oakland): Don't raise taxes to hire more cops! Parcel tax and parking tax increases for "violence prevention" would mainly go to hiring 63 more police officers. This is actually *worse* than March's Measure R, which we also opposed, with equally regressive taxes and spending even more weighted toward the police.

Vote **YES** on Measure Z (Oakland): Oakland Cannabis initiative. Make law enforcement related to private adult marijuana use, distribution, sale, cultivation and possession, the City's lowest law enforcement priority; and direct the City to lobby to change state and federal laws to legalize, tax and regulate marijuana for adult private use.
