What would Feinland do?

As a United States Senator, Marsha Feinland would introduce legislation to:

- ◆ Withdraw troops and advisors from Afghanistan, Iraq, Haiti and Colombia
- ◆ End aid to Israel until it withdraws to its pre-1967 borders
- ◆ Raise the minimum wage to \$15 per hour
- ◆ Create universal health care with a “single payer” (Canadian type) system— no insurance company profits
- ◆ Shorten the work week with no loss in pay and guarantee paid vacation time for all workers
- ◆ Repeal the Taft-Hartley Act — restore the right to strike and end “right to work” laws
- ◆ Abolish the death penalty
- ◆ End the phony “war on drugs” — legalize marijuana and decriminalize drug use
- ◆ Fully fund the U.S. government share of education costs, particularly special education
- ◆ End the war on children — stop the government mandated testing craze in public schools
- ◆ Protect the National Forests and other public and native lands from corporate exploitation
- ◆ Abolish the Senate and the Electoral College — one person, one vote
